Third Sunday of Lent (Year B)

3rd March 2024

Readings: Exodus 20:1-17 1 Corinthians 1:22-25 John 2:13-25

Ten Commandments

"I, the Lord, am your God, you shall not have other gods besides Me." The reading from Exodus goes on to prescribe the Ten Commandments given to Moses. It is worth remembering, not only because that is what the Church teaches but to form a good society with honourable human behaviour. What is important to consider today is God's instruction about not having other gods besides Him.

We find in the Gospel of the week one of the rare moments where the gently, soft-spoken, loving Jesus loses His cool. He is not only harsh in what He says, as sometimes in dealing the Pharisees and the Sadducees, but He turns mildly violent: "He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and He said, "Take these out of here, and stop making My Father's house a marketplace." "Strange", one would say, from a man who has nothing to say to the adulterous woman; or who sits and eats with the tax collectors and sinners and who teaches the parable of the prodigal son emphasizing the role of the forgiving father; or does not bother about His disciples breaking the law of the Sabbath, to become so terribly upset! Remember, Jesus has come to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of the Passover held most sacred by the Jews. What He sees there is enough to send Him into such a rage as to make Him turn the tables of the money changers. One also wonders how He is not a bit afraid that all those money changers and other men could get together, tie Him up and physically thrash Him thoroughly there and then.

What drives Jesus so mad that He does not care for His own physical safety, as he tells them, "How dare you turn My Father's house into a market?" That is, insulting the house of God is equivalent to demeaning God, whom Jesus loves dearly. Other sins can be forgiven but using a holy place or of religion to do business is not acceptable. Did He not say at another place in Mathew's Gospel, "whoever speaks a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him; but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit shall not be forgiven him, either in this age or in the age to come".

Soon after he began his ministry Jesus came to Jerusalem for the Passover. A pilgrimage to the temple was undertaken. The Passover itself was a celebration of liberation. That sacredness was destroyed by the atmosphere that prevailed in the temple: buying, selling and currency exchange! Instead of establishing a relationship with God, the place turned out to be a commercial centre dealing with money. He shows uncharacteristic anger, an unexpected outburst and cleans up the temple by turning the tales over and the chasing the animals away. Lent is a time to clean up the Temple of our body. Our life gets cluttered in ways we never planned. There may be merchants and moneychangers that need to be driven out of the temple of our lives. There could be a time to address the imperfections that may have grown into major areas of neglect.
