MISSION STATEMENT

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) 3rd September 2023

Readings: Jeremiah 20:7-9 Romans 12:1-2 Matthew 16:21-27

"Suffering and Death? To what purpose?"

"Suffering and Death? To what purpose?" Peter thinks. After entrusting to him the responsibility of the Kingdom that Jesus came to establish, where everything was going to be fabulous, how come Jesus has started talking about arrest, suffering and even death? In Peter's simple straightforward mind, something seems seriously wrong somewhere. Peter probably thinks that Jesus is testing his loyalty to Him. Whatever may have gone into his mind, his spontaneous reaction is to protect his master; such things should not happen to Jesus, as he is entrusted with the responsibility and the keys. But what must shock Peter even more are Jesus' harsh words, "Get behind Me, Satan." Within the course of four verses when Jesus entrusts to him the keys, he has now become a 'Satan'! Peter must be feeling terribly let down and insulted before other disciples. May be the remonstration from Jesus is so strong and clear that Peter does not enter further argument with Jesus.

I know a lot of people who get into arguments with God, when things do not go the way, they want them to. While it is a good thing to argue with God sometimes, we must know our own limits and, we should let God be God. The one reason, why Peter does not continue arguing with Jesus is what Jesus tells him and what we should ourselves learn from this passage: "You think like men and not like God." That is what I think is the crux of the matter and we would do well to see if Jesus could be uttering the same kinds of words to you and me, "You think like men and not like God."

One of the reasons we find the Gospels always challenging us is that we are unable to go into the deeper meaning and purpose of the words of Jesus. We often get caught at the superficial level of our own existence, where we see our success or failure in the way the world sees it. That is why, many a time, there is somehow a quick disconnect when I tell people to try to bring the meaning of the Cross into their lives. The other day, citing from the Gospel, Jesus' words on forgiveness, I was telling someone about the need to forgive his so-called enemy. He quickly shot back, "Jesus was God. I am only a human being. Do not expect me to act like Jesus." While he was logically quite right, he was looking at things the way men and not God sees them.

We, as Christians are indeed fortunate to be told about the meaning of suffering and to have the example of our Master who went through all that suffering, something He knew was coming when He went to Jerusalem. But do we ever try to understand the meaning of suffering in our lives, or many other things that happen to us which are not according to our plans or wishes?

If, therefore, He scolded Peter in strong words because he did not want Jesus to go through suffering, Jesus was teaching Peter and other followers about suffering being a necessary part of that Kingdom of which He had given him the keys a little while before the current incident.

Called to serve "a call within a call. The message was clear. I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them - to follow Christ into the slums to serve him among the poorest of the poor."

To follow Jesus into the places of abandonment, to see his face in lives ruined by illness, addiction, and mental anguish to the edges of desolation, to speak Jesus' language of compassion and mercy.

How can we possibly do this? For Mother Teresa there was no question.

We give thanks for God's grace, the compassion and mercy of Jesus and the soaring light of the Holy Spirit embodied in the frail frame of this courageous, resolute and faith filled woman, carrying so lightly the troubled world of affliction.
