Celebrating our 50th Year - 'From little things big things grow ...' 1

If you stood in St Peter's Church carpark area around 50 years ago you would see an open, roughly grassed paddock with a few scribbly gums and shrubby wattles. You may also have seen a tall man in a broad-brimmed hat, driving a well-used tractor, slashing the undergrowth, or tracing furrows up and down the paddock. At the wheel? Fr Rollo Enright, St Peter's first priest. These were our grassroots beginnings.

As a member of a settler family of timber millers and farmers in the Beaudesert area, Fr Rollo was no stranger to pioneering. The 1974 the landscape in Rochedale-Springwood still carried much of its rural character. Farms fringed our suburbs, there were no traffic lights, and many streets were yet to have kerbing and channelling.

The appointment of Fr Rollo and the foundation of our parish were announced in The Catholic Leader of 13 January 1974. We share the year of our foundation with parishes at Pine Rivers, Bald Hills and Kippa Ring. However, it would be at least 2 years before our Rochedale Road location was to celebrate its first Mass. During these very early years parish gatherings were held in-house at Toufik St or at the Rochedale Road State School. Some families continued to attend Sunday Mass at St Bernard's Mt Gravatt or St Martin's at Eight Mile Plains. We found it easier to corral the first two of our three boys at St Martin's where we met Rob and Trish Meulman doing much the same thing! Our family also attended St Declan's, a tiny, relocated church near the Shortland St exit from the freeway. It was advisable to arrive early in order to secure a seat. St Declan's survives today in the grounds of St Edward's at Daisy Hill – you will spot it easily as you drive along Chatswood Road.

For our family the St Peter's community has always been characterised by generosity of spirit. Even from the earliest days, this generosity was alive in the 'Make and Donate Campaign', led by our first Parish Secretary, June Richards; Charlie and Monica O'Leary – later a foundation teacher at the school; Mike and Marg Murphy; Jim Slingsby and Tom Jackson. To fit-out our temporary church, the furniture, altar furnishings, office equipment and supplies were all made or donated by families in the community. The multi-talented Mike Murphy made the Stations of the Cross and painted the portrait of Pope John Paul II. Signwriter Mike also supervised the artwork on the 'evangelical' Parish Bus ... but more about that at a later time. Our first 'church' was a re-purposed demountable building from the University of Queensland, trucked to our site and settled into the grassed school assembly area beside our current church. The redoubtable Jim Fleming wore out more than one pair of shoes, walking our streets, visiting homes to ensure people knew 'St Peter's is here!' and that they would be welcome. Our parish has been fortunate to include many people whose spiritual guidance and professional skills assisted both priests and people. Women of the Presentation Order fostered our welfare from our earliest times, with special care for the women and families of the parish – gifted women such as Sr Jocelyn Brown, Sr Mercia/Cecily Foster, Sr Patricia Ryan, Sr Patsy Grundy; and later Sr Janette Marsh from the Brigidine Order and Sr Rita Clancy OLSH.

FAITH MATTERS: The Lord's Prayer appears in the gospels of Mark and Luke.

In Luke's gospel the disciples prompt Jesus with their request, 'Lord, teach us to pray as John taught his disciples' - Luke 11: 1-4.

In Matthew's gospel (Matt 6: 9-13) we read a more familiar version of the Lord's Prayer, as part of the passage about Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.

Pope Francis has declared 2024 as the **Year of Prayer** in preparation for The Jubilee Year of Hope in 2025.

"I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare yourselves to live well this event of grace and to experience the strength of hope in God," he said, stating that the Year of Prayer is dedicated to "rediscovering the great value and absolute need of prayer in personal life, in the life of the Church, and of the world." 1

The **Our Father** presents us with a 'form of address' for our God and an 'order of things' as, on Jesus' invitation, we approach our God-as-father, not as a distant figure who, we fear, may miss our face and voice in the tumult of humanity. In the Lord's Prayer, we praise and glorify God and petition for what we need. There are seven petitions. The first three are addressed to God and draw us to him for his own sake: thy name, thy kingdom, thy will! The last four concern us and our needs that the Father fulfills: give us, forgive us, lead us not, deliver us. 2.

Pray in humility and trust:

Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread;

And forgive us our debts, As we also have forgiven our debtors; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Matt 6:9-13
