Readings: Acts 2:1-11 Romans 8:8-17 John 14:15-16, 23-26

Called to Serve

After Jesus ascended into heaven, how would the disciples have felt? Their teacher and friend had gone away again, after resurrecting from the dead, but where did that leave them? Though they had listened to Jesus and had followed him they did not know what to do and they were afraid. It wasn't until Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came upon them that the early church began its mission proclaiming the Good News to the whole world, beginning with those in Jerusalem.

All of God's people are bestowed with the Holy Spirit in their baptism and confirmation.

As human beings we are not perfect and we can not control much in our lives but the Holy Spirit, God's advocate, is with us in everything. In every success and in every failure. The Holy Spirit is there with us when we are afraid or when we don't know what to do, just like it was for the Apostles on that first Pentecost. It is through the Holy Spirit that we can proclaim the Good News in everyday life.

St Paul said "the Holy Spirit is given to us in different ways. That is for the good of all." (1 Corinthians 12:7) We have all been given gifts by the Holy Spirit and must use them. If we allow the Holy Spirit to move in us we can achieve great things for the kingdom of God. We can care for the poor and sick, fight for social justice and evangelise to our world. The Holy Spirit guides our personal actions, our parish community and its ministries.

One of the ministries in our parish is altar serving. Altar servers assist the priest during Mass and other liturgies. They are an important part of our liturgy as they help us to be present with each other, with the word of God and with the Eucharistic celebration. Carrying the cross, holding the candles, looking after the incense for the priest as well as setting the Altar for the Eucharist all enhance our ability to focus on the Mass.

Serving as an altar server is an important role and has great responsibility but is of great value to those who serve as well. We need to encourage our young people to offer their time and devotion to our Church. It is an opportunity for them to express their love of Jesus. It can help them feel a sense of ownership and belonging to their parish and the wider catholic community. It is also one of the many ways to bring young people to Mass and give them an opportunity to deepen their faith.

We are so thankful to those who currently serve and the many, many people who previously were altar servers and we would love to have a strong and plentiful roster of altar servers in our parish. This is why we are having an **Altar Serving training day on the 10th of July from 10.30am** with lunch, after Sunday morning Mass. It will begin with information for the parents, practical altar serving training and some games. Soccer anyone? Please pick up a permission slip and information flyer and we hope to see many young people there!



Pentecost Sequence

This weekend the Church celebrates the great Solemnity of Pentecost and there is a special feature in the liturgy this weekend, called the Pentecost Sequence. It is sung just after the second reading and leads straight into the Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia).

How did this practice of singing the sequence come about? Sequences developed out of the practice of the cantor extending the final 'a' of the gospel Alleluia on important celebrations. Gradually, words were added to the melody and by about the year 1000, the texts had been organised into extended rhyming verse. The words focussed on the particular feast or mystery being celebrated. These poems were always sung as hymns, never recited. After many reforms, they are now sung before the Gospel Acclamation, rather than as an extension at the end of the Alleluia.

The sequence is a joyful expression of the feast in which all can participate. If you can't quite catch the tune of the sequence, perhaps try joining in the 'Alleluia' refrain - give it a try! The words of the Pentecost Sequence have some beautiful expressions about the comfort that the Spirit brings to us as well as the joy that the Gifts of the Spirit inspire. Thinking of these may lead us to uncover more ideas and concepts of the mystery of the Holy Spirit. Let us do our best to join in celebrating Pentecost through our song!


