Second Sunday of Lent (Year A) 5th March 2023

Readings: Genesis 12:1-4 2 Timothy 1:8-10 Matthew 17:1-9

Transfiguration of Jesus: "embrace the cross with determined determination"

One story that runs from the first page of the Scripture to the last page is a similar story of extreme makeover calling and transforming. Abraham's encounter and covenant with God proved to be life-altering moment for him. No longer a wandering Aramean, rather he would become the father of a people. Changed by his experience of Christ, St. Paul continues to remind believers that our commitment to Christ will one day result in our transfiguration unto glory. In the transfiguration it was the inner being of Jesus that changed His outward appearance. His growing awareness of Himself and His role as God's Word of love for the world was becoming evident in Him. In His profound encounter with God, Jesus receives clarity about the next steps that He must take. He comes to understand that He has to go to Jerusalem and that He will be put to death there, but His death will not be the end of His life and mission. Rather, His exit from earthly life will bring the new liberation for God's people and thus comes the fulfillment of the promise that God the Father made to Abraham.

What does the incident of transfiguration show us? First, it is sharing the cross with Christ by carrying our own crosses. After the transfiguration Jesus did not bask in the glory of heaven, rather He became more aware about His mission of going to Jerusalem and fulfilling the mission He had been sent for by the Father. Explaining the transfiguration event to her sisters, St. Theresa of Calcutta said, "embrace the cross with determined determination." In doing so, she says "the person will struggle more courageously. He knows that come what may he will not turn back". He knows that it is only in carrying the cross with Christ that he will be glorified with Him. Secondly the event of transfiguration asks us to look inside. I remember the story of a beggar who had been sitting by the side of the road for many years. One day, a stranger walked by the beggar asked him for spare change. "What is that you are sitting on?" the stranger asked. "Just an old box that I have been using for as long as I can remember", replied the beggar. "Did you ever look inside?" asked the stranger. "No, what is the point? There is nothing in there." But the stranger insisted. The beggar tried and managed to open the lid, and with astonishment and joy he discovered that the box was filled with gold.

Thirdly, the transfiguration episode invites us to listen to God. We all know firsthand that life has its ups and downs, successes, and failures as Jesus certainly experienced. But we are assured that God stands by us and blesses us, no matter what, even when we are frustrated or embarrassed. But if we don't listen to Him or if we are filled with noises we will be unable to hear Him. It is when we look inside, and it is in that calmness that we can hear Him speaking to us. Then we know that our real claim to fame is that we are so deeply loved.

Faith Matters: Our Transfiguration

Jesus becomes as light itself; the three apostles are at once spell-bound and nonplussed; they don't know what to say or do; the Father speaks aloud. We can see the three were very powerfully affected and wonderfully uplifted by what they witnessed. Then Jesus tells them not to mention to anyone else what happened until he rises again!

It must have been really hard for them to restrain themselves from pouring out to everyone else the glory and wonder of what they had seen. Yet, like when the Israelites couldn't bear to look upon the face of Moses when he came down from speaking with God on Sinai, the other disciples must surely have recognised a significant change in the countenances of Peter, James and John when they returned from their mountain-top encounter with God. It would have been both life-changing and profoundly bewildering for the three for some time after.

With the passage of time, however, the nitty-gritty of everyday life would have gradually worn away the magnitude of their experience, and their memories may have dimmed, leaving them wondering, perhaps, what really happened, and whether it was even real

The Israelites saw God work mighty wonders in the process of his releasing them from their abject slavery in Egypt. And yet, when wandering through the desert, with its accompanying lack of water and food, it was not too long before they started to focus on their discomforts, losing sight of God's glorious power and his incomparable ability to look after them.

We are forgetful creatures. We need constant reminders of the powerful, wonderful, uplifting, momentous things God has done in our own lives, or we tend to lose our vision.

When Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me", he was calling us to bring into the present moment, repeatedly, the immense power, wonder and love of his supreme, life-giving gift to us, so that we might never lose sight of its value and potency in our everyday lives.
