Readings: Acts 4:32-35 1 John 5:1-6 John 20:19-31

The Doubting Thomas

Thomas refused to believe when his companions told him that Jesus had appeared to some of them. He had said, "Unless I see the nail marks in His hands and put my finger on those scars, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." Thomas spent between the time when a doubt arose in his mind and the time that Jesus appeared to him eight days later.

Does he spend his days in depression because his Master, died a shameful death? Or does he contemplate going back home to till his land, or go fishing, or start a new business? Might he be thinking he has wasted his time? Or does he spend the time completely confused? Or they spread lies and should stop doing so immediately? Or maybe he starts arguing with God about what he heard? We never doubt the resurrection and the gift of eternal life. What is worth reflecting on today is the doubting Thomas' eight days' time vis-à-vis our own experience when God appears absent from our life, may be for eight days or eight months or even eight years. When we keep praying for something very urgent God seems not answer our prayers, what kind of thoughts go through our minds at that time? Do we not, like Thomas, want God to intervene in a more concrete way where we could see proof of His presence?

Don't we become like doubting Thomas? I know people who argue with God, just because they want something here and now. Thomas' doubt regarding Jesus' resurrection is not addressed instantly. He is made to wait, to struggle for a time and is probably even left confused. In our journey of faith too, we are left to struggle or be confused. Like Thomas, we may not find immediate solutions.

MERCY SUNDAY - FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY

In 2000 Pope John Paul II instituted the Feast of Divine Mercy. It arises out of a series of apparitions to Sr. Faustina. When canonizing her, he said, today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina to the Church as a gift of God. In April 1978, Rome permitted spread of this devotion. Today we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy. St. Faustina was privileged to receive apparitions from Jesus emphasizing His mercy. Our attitude should be one of total trust in Jesus' Divine Mercy. Jesus told to St. Faustina to tell the whole world about His inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

The second teaching is to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Communion on this Feast. The third teaching is to tell the whole world of My great mercy. We are to be merciful in three ways by deed, word, and prayer. It reminds us of many parables taught by Jesus emphasizing God's mercy. God is like a shepherd who leaves ninety-nine sheep to go in search of the lost. God is like a woman searches the entire house to find the lost coin. God is like a father who welcomes back his prodigal son.




