Fair Trade

What is Fair Trade: Fair Trade farmers, working in democratic cooperatives including other small business producers of products such as food, clothing, textiles, and crafts, receive a minimum price for their produce. In addition, producer organisations receive the Fair-Trade Premium. The premium can be invested in wells, hospitals, better farming equipment and sustainable farming methods that can improve the living standards of farmers, small producers and their families.

How Fairtrade works towards a living income: In addition to the benefits of the Fairtrade Minimum Price and Premium, Fair Trade aims to establish a Living Income Reference Price. A living income is defined as sufficient income to afford a decent standard of living for all household members – including a nutritious diet, clean water, decent housing, education, health care and other essential needs, plus a little extra for emergencies and savings – once farm costs are covered. *Living income - (fairtrade.net)*

Given that farmers in developing countries struggle to earn a living income, this Fair Trade initiative will go a long way to improving their living standards. Fair Trade have calculated Living Income Reference Prices for West African cocoa, coffee and vanilla. One of our closest neighbours is Tonga who are the seventh largest producers of Vanilla in the world. https://sciencea-gri.com/10-biggest-countries-of-vanilla-production-in-the-world

However, cyclones and El Nino climate events have impacted growers of vanilla significantly in recent years. Without the assistance of Fairtrade, many small farmers would not be able to earn a living income. Fairtrade Australia and New Zealand has been supporting vanilla farmers in Tonga since 2013. The Vanilla Growers Association of Vava'u (VGA) is the only Fairtrade certified producer organisation in Tonga which is made up of 302 vanilla growing households. They have chosen to work together to secure committed market access and business and community development opportunities through the Fairtrade minimum price and premium. The Catholic Church Response: Pope Francis states that the economy must serve the planet and its people not profits. Each of us is called to do our part as consumers to ensure that the economy works for everyone. Pope Benedict XVI reminded us that as consumers we have a specific social responsibility: "It is good for people to realize that purchasing is always a moral—and not simply—economic act. Hence the consumer has a specific social responsibility, which goes hand-in-hand with the social responsibility of the enterprise." (Charity in Truth, no. 66)

Fair Trade creates opportunities for us to respond to this call in a small but significant way every day through the choices we make as consumers. When we make the conscious choice to purchase Fair Trade items, we are putting the values of Catholic social teaching into action and working to realize our vision of economic justice. We can support the people of Tonga and many other developing nations by purchasing Fair Trade items in many stores in Australia and overseas. We should research the companies we buy products from and give our support to the ones which have responsible business practices and transparent supply chains.

St. LukeThe Fifth Sunday of Easter: Priority IV: Responding to Abuse and the Abused

Archbishop Mark writes: In responding to abuse and the abused, we need to move beyond considerations of law and finance... Of course, we need to attend to legal and financial matters, but the paramount concern needs to be the good of those abused. Not all victims and survivors look to the Church for spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and care, but some do, and others may in time, if ever trust can be established. We can learn from experience elsewhere in seeking to respond more effectively to abuse and the abused. Unless we do, this will remain a gaping wound – certainly for victims and survivors but for the whole Church as well – which makes it hard for us to move in the future.

As such, we must look beyond those who have mis-represented God, to the one who came to us as God made flesh, Jesus. It is in Jesus that our understanding of God, broken by scandal in the Church, can be restored. The God that Jesus reveals to us is gracious, merciful, filled with compassion, slow to anger and abounding in love. The God revealed in Christ works to heal the wounds of sin and comfort the most broken and vulnerable. Jesus bestows mercy on the woman caught in adultery, transforms the life of Zacchaeus the tax collector, heals the bleeding woman, and calls out the Pharisees when they mis-represent the God they claim to follow. Jesus challenges us when he says, "very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do." In the wake of this great scandal, we are all called to be like Jesus, in order that we might take small steps to respond to abuse and the abused.


