Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) 9th July 2023

Readings: Zechariah 9:9-10 Romans 8:9,11-13 Matthew 11:25-30

"Be a giver and not a taker"

"Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Jesus offers to all those who are heavily laden, to come and rest with Hm, to learn from His humility and finally to take His yoke which is easy and light. Jesus is fully aware of our human condition, in which we go through all kinds of problems, pains, betrayals, physical illnesses, disappointments causing despair, psychological traumas, misunderstandings from our own, lack of faith in God, moments when our prayers are not answered, extreme poverty, leaving many hungry or without shelter or clothing, and so on. Knowing fully well that it is almost impossible for us to overcome these by ourselves, Jesus invites us to come to Him to find rest. And the irony is he is speaking it to people who will not listen to him.

The immediate text before this passage, he gets a little bit angry at them. He says, "Why are you not listening?" But then he suddenly, instead of being upset and annoyed, he turns back again, and he says to them, "You know, the things that have been done here, if they were done in Sodom and Gomorrah, they would have come back and repented and turned their lives around and come back to the Lord."

Jesus teaches people with great tenderness, not because they deserve it, but because he needs to be this way. "Our hearts will never rest until they rest in you," says St Augustine to God. What does he do when they finally have their way and nail him to a cross, He looks up at his Father and prays, "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing."

If you want to remember today's message, just think of one word, **okay**? Are we okay? Our problem is to learn to be a giver and not a taker. That is all: just to be a giver and not a taker. Are you worried about nobody loving you? Are you worried about not being accepted? Are you worried about you are not going to climb high on the ladder? You may just forget it. If people want to climb high on the ladder, help them. If people want to do this, that, and the other thing, help them. Why? Because they are people. Jesus doesn't give up on them. You do not have to give up on them.

But, if you want to touch God and feel the reality of God's life and this wonderful world that He has created for all of us, you have got to learn how to give. And the more you give, the more you will understand. And the more you understand, the more you realise how much we need forgiveness. Because when you go in that direction, all your little faults, all your little problems, seem to increase.

But so does this great feeling that you are with a God who is carrying you through all the difficulties of life. And at times you feel that you are dropped, but He always catches you in time. At times you feel frustrated, but He has always been there to smile at you. "Be a giver and not a taker".

FAITH MATTERS: Discipleship

Fr Johny's homily last weekend regarding the cost of discipleship may have been a bit confronting when considering the apparent severity of Jesus' call on our lives.

Isn't our Catholic way of life meant to be based on prayer, the Mass, participation in the sacraments, and being a decent human being?

The wonderful aspect of Jesus' sufferings, death and resurrection is that we who choose to accept the free gift of salvation that God won for us in Jesus, have been saved from the horrors of Hell, and given the key to Heaven's grace, beauty and wonder in the full experience of God's immense suffered love for us. Jesus to give us the opportunity to experience "life in abundance"(Jn 10:10), but not without challenges. Jesus said people of the world will hate us because we uphold the standards Jesus stood for (Jn 15:18).

How does that affect our daily life as Christians? Doesn't it mean there are times when we are called to stand up for what is good and right, even when it's inconvenient and we may be shouted down and ostracised? Or do we just try to keep our heads down and avoid awkward confrontation with others over moral issues? We all fail to act courageously at some point, just like Peter, but so long as we keep refocussing on God's loving way, we will triumph in the end. And as far as suffering death in this world is concerned, it is eternal Life that is our true goal, not a pleasant, unruffled life in this passing world.

Family comes second to God? If this notion seems askew, it is essential to recognize that putting God first in ALL aspects of our life – no matter what – gives us a heavenly perspective. We gain peace, insight and right balance – God's heart for it all. Faith Enrichment Ministry
