Make It Happen: Choose Fair Trade

What is Fair Trade?: Fair Trade advocates for better working conditions and improved terms of trade for farmers and workers in developing countries. It is about supporting the development of farming and worker communities to have more control over their futures and protecting the environment in which they live and work. Fair Trade farmers, who work in democratic cooperatives and other small business producers of products such as food, clothing, textiles, and crafts, receive a minimum price for their produce. In addition, producer organisations receive the Fair Trade Premium. The premium can be invested in wells, hospitals, better farming equipment and sustainable farming methods that can improve the living standards of farmers, small producers and their families.

Fair Trade - Changing people's lives: Creating a positive difference in people's lives is at the core of what Fair Trade is doing in many developing countries around the world. This means empowering farmers and workers with a voice to change their own lives, and to do so in a collaborative, equitable and transparent way. In Papua New Guinea, Highlands Organic Agriculture Corporative (HOAC) is a Fair Trade certified organisation in the Pacific since 2005. With the support of partners, such as Grinders Coffee Roasters, HOAC have reinvested back into developing their businesses and community, benefitting over 15,100 people in the region. Secure housing has been an issue with traditional homes rebuilt every five years due to the weakening of thatched roofs made from kunai grass. They have been able to purchase roofing iron for 200 households, providing longer lasting and durable homes. The new homes will enable families and their communities to have separate spaces for cooking, sleeping, and storing coffee. (www.grinderscoffee.com.au/the-longest-fairtrade-certified-organisation/). Fair Trade helps people achieve financial security and obtain more power at the negotiating table, making them less vulnerable to poverty. The Fairtrade Premium enables farmers to invest in strengthening their businesses, improving their local communities and to plan for their future. The Catholic Church Response: Each of us is called to do our part as consumers to ensure that the economy works for everyone. Pope Benedict XVI reminds us that as consumers we have a specific social responsibility: "It is good for people to realize that purchasing is always a moral—and not simply—economic act. Hence the consumer has a specific social responsibility, which goes hand-in-hand with the social responsibility of the enterprise." (Caritas in Veritate, no. 66) Fair Trade creates opportunities for us to respond to this call in a small but significant way every day through the choices we make as consumers. When we make the conscious choice to purchase Fair Trade items, we are putting the values of Catholic social teaching into action and working to realize our vision of economic justice. (www.crsfairtrade.org) We can support fair traded goods by purchasing Fair Trade items in many stores in Australia and overseas. We should research the companies we buy products from and give our support to the ones which have responsible business practices and transparent supply chains.

Saints Days This Week

St Athanasius - 2nd May

Born in 295. Buried on this day in 373 at Alexandria (Egypt). Attended the first ecumenical council of Nicaea as a deacon. Later, as bishop of Alexandria, he upheld that council's doctrine in the face of great opposition from Arians, including several emperors. Sent into exile a number of times. Venerated as the "Father of Orthodoxy" for championing the true and equal divinity of the incarnate Son of God.

Sts Philip and James - 3rd May

Philip, from Bethsaida in Galilee, became a disciple of Jesus and one of the twelve. Recorded in the Fourth Gospel as recognising in Jesus the one foretold by Moses and the prophets (John 1:45) and as introducing Gentiles to the Lord (John 12:20-22). According to Acts 8:5, he was the first to preach the gospel to non-Jews.

James, son of Alphaeus, was also one of the twelve called by Jesus (Mark 3:18ff). Known as James the Less. Venerated traditionally as the author of the letter of James and as leader of the Church in Jerusalem, where he died in the year 62.

The joint feast of Philip and James has been celebrated in Rome since at least the sixth century.
