Readings: Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17 Matthew 4:12-23

The American spiritual writer, Patty Houser, wrote: 'I never listen to what a person says. I look at what a person does because what they do tells me who they really are'. We all know this as the maxim, 'Actions speak louder than words'. This maxim was first recorded in 1628 from John Pym, an English parliamentarian, whose attempted arrest in 1642 by Charles I sparked the English Civil War. We have all heard it so often that we believe it. It is certainly true that our actions reveal us to others, but I would not go as far as Patty Houser and say that I never listen to what a person says. As much as our actions are important, I think that our words are pretty important as well.

The author of the gospel in Matthew's name knew this. Whoever wrote it—scholarship generally thinks that it was written about AD 80 in Antioch, near the modern Turkish city of Antakya, near the Syrian border—was part of a community of Christian Jews who had formed around Matthew, one of the Twelve. Matthew's Gospel emphasises how Jesus fulfils the Hebrew Scriptures, and today's passage about Isaiah's prophecy about the land of Zebulun and of Naphtali is no exception. The centre of the gospel has five parts, and each part is divided into two: what Jesus does (the narrative) and what Jesus says (the discourse). Today we are hearing from the narrative of the first part. In the following five weeks we shall read from the discourse of the first part. Interestingly, whoever put our scriptural readings together seems to be telling us that words are more important than actions, since we get five weeks of words but only this one week of action. But we can leave that aside.

In our reading today we get only a small extract from the first narrative that includes the call of the first disciples (a good reason not to read the shorter form of the gospel, which even cuts out the call). We begin with a one-line summary of the central message of Jesus: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'. We heard these same words on the Second Sunday in Advent on the lips of John the Baptist. We shall hear them again throughout the season of Lent. 'Repent.' It is worth saying again that the Greek imperative verb *metanoete* means to turn around and head in a completely new direction. Jesus came to stop us getting lost and to point us in the right direction; he came to help us find God again. Today we meet four small-businessmen, Simon and Andrew, James and John. They have a little food-supply industry. We hear time and again these days that small business is the backbone of the economy. These four guys are making their contribution to the economic development of their community. This is what many of us also do.

Now, as important as that is for their own success and prosperity, Jesus calls them to follow him, calls them to leave that all behind. Why would he do that? And why would they listen to him? As St Augustine says in one of his homilies (Sermo 96), 'What the Lord has commanded seems hard and harsh, that any who wish to follow him should deny themselves'. Why does anyone take up a sea change? It is all about finding meaning and purpose in life. It is not that there is anything wrong with working, but Jesus calls us to see that there is more to life than this. Augustine says, 'learn to love yourself by not loving yourself'. In other words, put things into perspective. This is what it means to turn around and head off in the right direction.

Today we can thank God that, like Simon and Andrew, James and John, each one of us is called by Jesus to repent, to turn around, to go in the right direction. We can be thankful that each one of us is called to follow him, to fish not for food but for life. The Eucharist of the broken body and the blood poured out is the direction we are to follow; it is the life we are to seek.

Faith Matters: Feast Days this week

SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES: Born in Savoy (France) in 1567. Died in Lyons in 1622. As a presbyter and as bishop of Geneva, he played a major part in the renewal of 17th-century French Catholicism. Seen by many as an early proponent of ecumenical dialogue. Founded the Visitation order with Saint Jane Frances de Chantal (12 December). His writings promoted a spirituality for laypeople. Remembered as a most influential preacher, writer, and spiritual director, who combined firmness with patience and gentleness.

THE CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL: This date, first linked with the conversion of Saint Paul in the so-called Martyrdom of Jerome (c. 431), became established in the liturgy of Gaul. Celebrates the work of God's grace at a major turning point in the life of Paul himself and in the history of the infant Church.

AUSTRALIA DAY: This is the date of the arrival in 1788 of the first European settlers in Australia. The liturgy marks Australia's national day with prayers seeking God's blessing on all of its peoples and commending its destiny into God's hands.

SAINT THOMAS AQUINAS: Born near Aquino (Italy) about 1225. Died on his way to the Council of Lyons in 1274. Educated at Monte Cassino, Naples, Paris, and Cologne, he became a Dominican in 1244. Regarded as one of the greatest theologians in the history of the Church. Despite ecclesiastical opposition at the time, the substance of his life's work has endured as an authentic exposition of Christian teaching and carries unique official approval. Remembered for his modesty, the prayerfulness of his personal life, and the abiding influence of his thought.

Catholic Foundations module 1: Catholic Theology in Context

The Archdiocesan Centre for Catholic Formation's four core modules entitled 'Catholic Foundations' are designed to draw Catholics into the fullness of the Catholic life and provide formation for those considering ministry roles.
