# "Remain in My Love"

Last Sunday Jesus appealed to us, "Abide in Me," and today, His appeal is "Remain in My love" and "that My joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." We need to recall the incident of killing Mr. Graham Staines and his two children in India (Australians) and the forgiveness of his wife, and the heinous crime committed on certain other Christians and the forgiveness they showed immediately are some examples of remaining in Jesus' Love. Once a Muslim Man asked the whole world, "from where do the people of your religion get this spirit to forgive others after undergoing such heinous crimes and surprise the whole world?" Jesus had taught about forgiveness on different occasions. But if religious instructions and teachings alone could transform people, we would probably have had a peaceful world. The fact is that there are individuals who surprise the world.

There are many similar people who accepted the invitation of Jesus to 'abide in me' and 'remain in My love.' When we accept the appeal of Jesus, we will find in our life a transforming effect taking place. After having encountered the indescribable crime, the serenity and calm nature of these people's face witnessed is Jesus' love. And such witness to God's love, forgive-ness and joy can be exhibited as a great witness to Jesus' love and joy. "It was not you who chose Me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain so that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you. This I command you: love one another."

Love is to be steady when circumstances become unstable, jobs are lost, home is robbed, and the future seems frighteningly insecure. Love is faithful despite the temptation to stray. Love is ready to forgive the hurtful aspects of life together. Love is a sure shelter against danger. Love is a rock to hold onto when the wedding vows about sickness and health, for richer and poorer become everyday realities.

In the past, some Native American people had a rite of passage when a young man came of age, "a rite of passage into manhood." On a young warrior's thirteenth birthday, he would be escorted out of his village by the adult warriors of that village. He was taken miles from his home into the depths of the forest. At sunset the warriors left him alone to face the unknown terrors of the forest. Darkness settled in and he was faced with the fears of the unseen and unknown. The wind made strange noises, the wild animals howled, the rustling shifting leaves sounded just like the approach of a mortal enemy. The dark night seemed endless. After enduring the night without a wink of sleep, dawn began to break. He began to see the forest for what it really is. Majestic trees swayed in the wind; colourful flowers were blooming while the local wildlife searched for food. It was beautiful. To his total surprise, as the light began to grow brighter, he saw an imposing male figure only a few yards away from. It was his own father standing there all night long, ready to protect him in an instant from the perils of the night forest.

#### FAITH MATTERS: Does God's call to holiness seem too hard?

In my own walk with God, over so many years, my true conversion to 'knowing, loving and serving God' has been very slow.

As a youth, I occasionally thought I was pretty well sinless – nearly a saint! But that, of course, came from a very poor recognition of where sin lay in my life, and how serious my faults were. The closer I move to God, the more I realise how spiritually impoverished I am, how far I am from clearing the bar, and how much I have needed Jesus' saving love from that painful, ignominious cross.

They say that until you recognise your own sinfulness, and inability to conquer it, you can never truly appreciate the enormity of the Father's love and Jesus' sacrifice for our sins.

It wasn't until my mind and heart were opened to this, that I specifically put my life, heart, and desires into God's hands.

Even though that was a huge step forward, I have taken a long time to implement much of my surrender. Although, more recently, I seem to have been able to draw on God's grace more effectively, and have seen genuine progress in different areas of my life.

I keep reminding myself that it is not what I seem like in other people's eyes that counts, but that my heart is constantly refocused on God and his loving plan for this world.

Genuine humility, love, and a willingness to rejoice no matter what– choosing to trust that God is wonderfully in control – is what helps me actually grow.

I can't MAKE myself better, but if I face my weaknesses, ask for God's grace, then in God-awareness seek to be Jesus' presence in my world, God will win!
